Objective: achieving general competence in Polish at the A1 level, in particular the following language skills: listening comprehension of numerals, politeness structures and simple questions. Interaction in the social context. Ability to write simple words in Polish. Attempting to use the language in everyday life. Maintaining contact - <i>nie rozumiem, proszę powtórzyć, proszę mówić wolniej.</i>
